Description:	Christian Academy of Guatemala is an independent, non-profit, non-denominational, college preparatory institution offering a biblically-based, rigorous, academic program modeled after the best educational practices and methodologies of the United States. It is founded on the principles of coeducational, bi-cultural (Guatemala/United States) teaching practices. Respect for political, social, and ethnic diversity is a fundamental part of the school's identity.				
Organization:	The school was founded in 1974 by several missionary families to serve evangelical English-speaking missionaries with the educational needs of their children. The school now consists of two-thirds missionary and one-third non-missionary families. There are three sections: Elementary (Pre-Kindergarten-grade 5), Middle (grades 6–8), and High school (grades 9–12). The Director is the head of school.				
Mission:	Christian Academy of Guatemala exists to support the missionary community in Guatemala by providing a biblically-based, quality English education to prepare lives for Christian service.				
Vision:	Students at Christian Academy of Guatemala will be grounded in God's Word and challenged to achieve academic excellence as they prepare to use their gifts and abilities effectively to follow God's plan for their lives.

Statement of Faith:	We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments are inspired by God and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are of supreme and final authority in faith and conduct.				
Accreditation and Associations:	The School is dual-accredited by both COGNIA and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) for our K-12 classes. We are a member school of the Child Safety & Protection Network (CSPN).				
Faculty:	Our faculty currently has 34 teachers from the United States, Guatemala, Korea, China, or Honduras.  Average core class size is 9 (elementary) and 15 (secondary)				
Enrollment:	143 students (56 in Elementary, 32 in Middle, and 55 in High School)				
Curriculum:	The curriculum is that of a U.S. college-preparatory school. Instruction is given in English. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered through Sevenstar Online Academy and Northstar Academy for an additional cost if the school does not have an AP teacher for a particular course. Dual Enrollment is offered through Liberty University and other approved colleges. AP, DE & Honors classes are weighted at 5.0.

University Acceptance:	80% of our 2021 graduates are attending 4-year universities. 20% are taking a gap year, joined the military, or plan to begin college in January 2022. Graduates of CAG have been accepted to Harvard, Columbia University, Purdue University, Seoul National University, Biola University, Boston University, Wheaton College, Calvin College, Messiah, Indiana Wesleyan, University of California Berkeley, North Greenville University, Liberty University, Yonsei University, Korea University, Universidad Francisco Marroquin, Universidad del Valle de Guatemala, Pontifical Xavuerian, ESSEC Business School in France, University of Leuven - KU Leuven, Belgium.
